



# Louis-Pierre Bougie Grant For Emerging Printmaking Artists 2024-2025

## CALL FOR SUBMISSIONS

### Deadline : May 5th 2024

Atelier Circulaire is launching the 6th edition of the Louis-Pierre Bougie Grant For Emerging Printmaking Artists, which aims to recognize the quality of an emerging artist's artistic work and encourage the sustainable inclusion of young artists in the visual arts community.

The grant offers a 12-month residency (from June 1, 2024 to May 30, 2025) to an emerging artist for the realization of a residency project at the Atelier Circulaire. During this period, the Atelier Circulaire provides various technical, material and human resources to accompany the artist in the production of their work.

This grant is also an opportunity to work in a stimulating environment, which encourages research, experimentation and hybridity of techniques. Each year, the selection of the submitted projects is made by an independent jury, based on the following criteria : the artistic quality of the proposal, the relevance of the project and its technical feasibility according to the means available to the production studio.



## The grant includes :

- 12-month workshop package (\$1320 value)
- 25 hours of coaching or training (\$1000 value)
- A \$300 credit at the Atelier Circulaire's store
- Free technical support during the Fridays at the studio
- Residency presentation and exhibition in the members' gallery
- Participation in calls for proposals reserved for members
- Diffusion and promotion

## Terms of Participation :

- Be a professional artist or in the process of becoming one\*
- Be under 40 years of age on the application deadline date

**OR**

- Have a maximum of five years of professional artistic practice at the time of application. The number of years of artistic practice is determined by considering an applicant's entire career, and includes the number of years of practice in another discipline.

*\*Possess peer-recognized competence in the visual arts (e.g.: have received a grant from an institution, an award or a mention from a professional jury, be a member of your professional association, etc.), or have had at least one public exhibition of your work in a professional context.*

## Application Contents :

- Curriculum vitae (PDF document)
- Artist's biography and artistic approach (PDF document, max. 500 words)
- Presentation of the project, mentioning the printmaking technique(s) to be used and the planned process (max. 500 words)
- Present a global work plan for the 12 months of residency
- Portfolio of 5 to 15 images (JPEG or grouped in a PDF)
- A descriptive list of the works (title, year, technique and dimensions).
- If necessary, video or audio documentation can be sent via Vimeo or YouTube links

## To submit your application :

- Applicants have until midnight on Sunday, May 5, 2024 to submit their applications
